INFRASTRUCTURE WA PROPOSAL FOR PUBLIC CONSULTATION

The Chamber of Minerals and Energy of Western Australia (CME) is the peak resources sector representative body in Western Australia. CME welcomes the release of the Proposed Model for Infrastructure WA.
